A regular meeting of the Rifle City Council was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Pro-Tem Theresa Hamilton.

RECEIVE PRESENTATION FROM MOUNTAIN WASTE & RECYCLING

Mike Hinkley and Doug Goldsmith from Mountain Waste and Recycling presented to Council the Annual Diversion Report for 2018. The report was comprised of figures using a diversion rate, which compares the amount of material that was recycled or diverted from the landfill compared to the total waste generated by the City of Rifle.

CONSIDER PROPOSAL FOR CENTENNIAL PARKWAY CONSTRUCTION FROM WESTEC CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT COMPANY

Council Hostettler recused himself due to conflict of interest and left the Council Chambers.

Planning Director Nathan Lindquist stated Westec Construction Management has submitted a proposal in the amount of \$780,920.00 for the reconstruction of Centennial Parkway. The reconstruction of Centennial Parkway includes reconstruction of a portion of West Avenue, a new access to the Park n Ride parking lot and a new bus stop area for loading and unloading passengers. The City budgeted \$800,000 for this project in the 2019 budget. The project is funded using the \$5.6 million CDOT Devolution Grant the City received in 2015. Staff recommends approval of the Westec Construction Management proposal for the reconstruction Centennial Parkway.

Councilor Green moved to approve the proposal for construction at Centennial Parkway by Westec Construction Management Company in an amount of \$780,920.00; seconded by Councilor Elliott.

7-PARTY MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) REGARDING GARFIELD COUNTY SENIOR PROGRAMS FOR 2019

Senior Center Director Tami Sours noted the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that governs the 2019 Garfield County Senior Programs consists of 7 parties. The seven parties are Carbondale, Glenwood Springs, New Castle, Silt, Rifle, RFTA, and Garfield County. Under the 2019 MOU, the City of Rifle will see an increase of \$15,514.09 for meals and transportation. The Senior Transportation Services will increase of \$9,035.68 with a total cost of \$118,021.85 and Senior Meal Services showing an increase of \$6,478.41 with a total cost of \$9,739.90. Staff recommends approval of the 7-party MOU for the 2019 Garfield County Senior Programs.

Councilor Elliott moved to approve the 7-Party Memorandum of Understanding regarding Garfield County Senior Programs for 2019 as presented; seconded by Councilor Carpenter.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT (IGA) WITH GARFIELD COUNTY FOR 2019 MOSQUITO CONTROL

Parks and Recreation Director Tom Whitmore explained the City of Rifle has been working with Garfield County since and the municipalities of Garfield County since 2003, to provide a comprehensive mosquito and vector disease control program. Garfield County provides administration of the Mosquito Control IGA and conducts an RFP process every three years. Each town in the county pays a prorated share of the \$176,972.00. The City portion of the 2019 Mosquito Control IGA with Garfield County is \$19,320.00. \$20,000.00 was budgeted for the mosquito control program for 2019. Staff recommends approval of the 2019 Mosquito Control IGA for the requested amount of \$19,320.00.

Councilor Elliot moved to approve the IGA with Garfield County for 2019 Mosquito Control as \$19,320; seconded by Councilor Hostettler.
